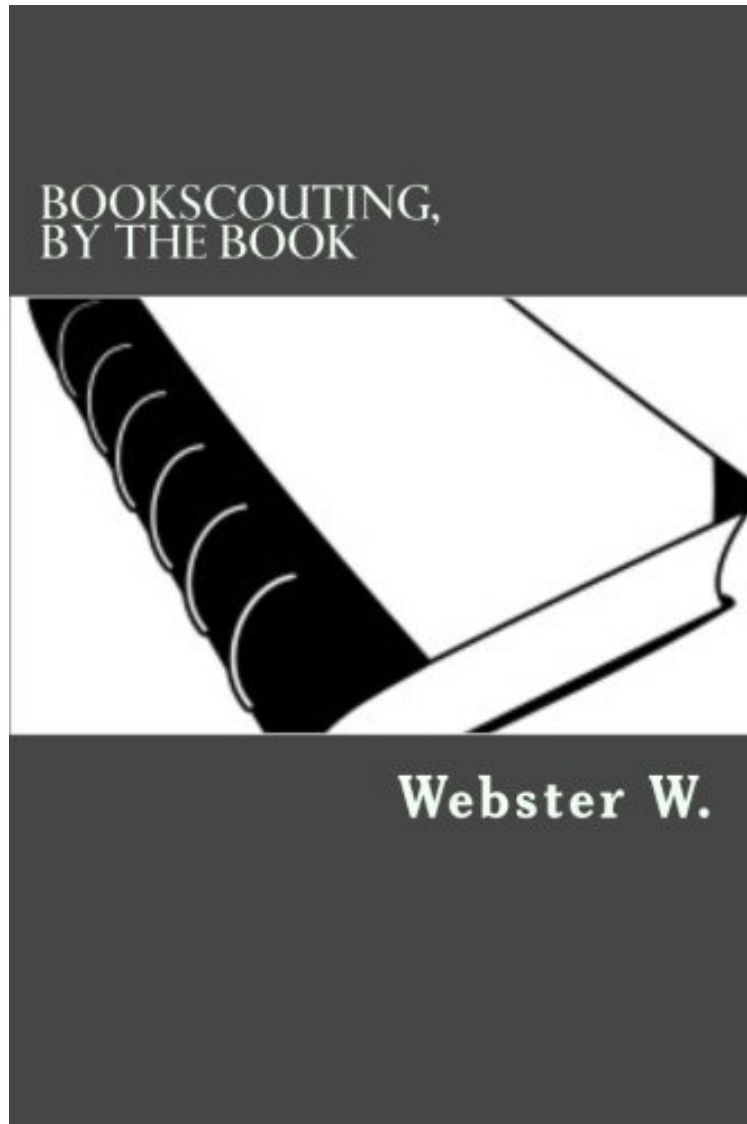

I had to laugh because I had this very morning plunged into a thrift-dump bin of hundreds of books, pawed through, got an armful of titles and moved on by the time the Little Ole Lady in Sneakers had scanned oh, maybe six books which I could tell at a glance were utterly worthless.
