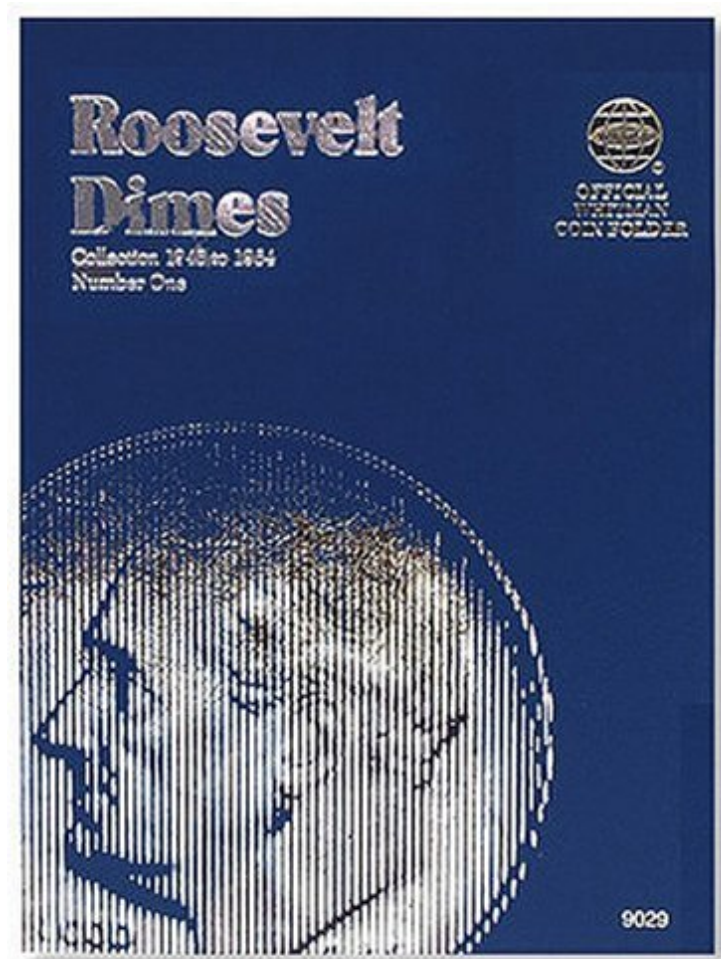

the user must be smarter than the product! Yes, the backing of the slots is flimsy... so just insert the coin into the slot while the book rests on a hard surface like a kitchen counter or desk. DO NOT try an insert a coin on carpet or another 'cushy' surface - it will puncture the backing! I've never had any problems with any of them. They're all high-quality for a low price.They hold coins snugly without them popping out and you can also remove coins if you wish to replace them.I recommend using a pen-point and a dish towel to push the coins in. You use the towel as a cover to avoid scratching the coin and thepen point as leverage to push the coin in easily.All that's left is to find some silver dimes to fill up this folder!
