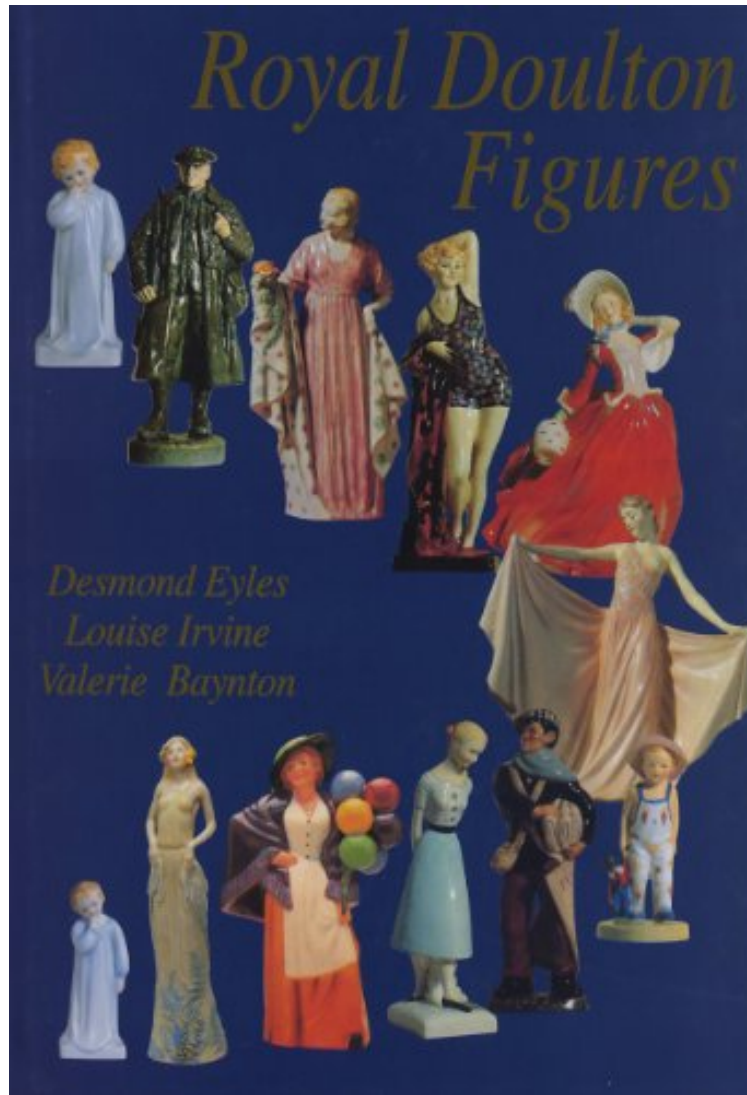

book from 1978 covers those pieces numbered HN 1 through HN 2865. I have just begun a Royal Doulton figurine collection, starting with the 1937 creation Top O' The Hill, a lovely windblown lady in a red dress hat that held nostalgic appeal for me as an aunt owned her - although as of 1978 this mold was still active, so I doubt that my online purchased figure is the same year as my aunt's. Today the HN numbered figurines sold online are in the 5000's, and they are no longer exclusively from England, as I purchased one of their Pretty Ladies series recently made in Thailand, so if your numbers are above 2865 I suggest to keep looking for newer editions of these reference guides. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. There was a soft cover supplement published to bring us up to date before a new and larger edition was published but if the cutoff date suits the era of your collection then there will be no better book for you than this volume.
