The second part devotes pages to the some of her jewelry and some of his trinkets that went up for auction back in the 80's. The photos of the jewelry and trinkets is good. The story, for those who already know it, will not offer any new insights. I mainly purchased this book to see the auction items and to see what they sold for. At the beginning of the book, there is a numbered list of each item in the book, what the auction estimate was and what the final sale price was in Swiss Francs and US dollars (including the premium paid by the buyer).
