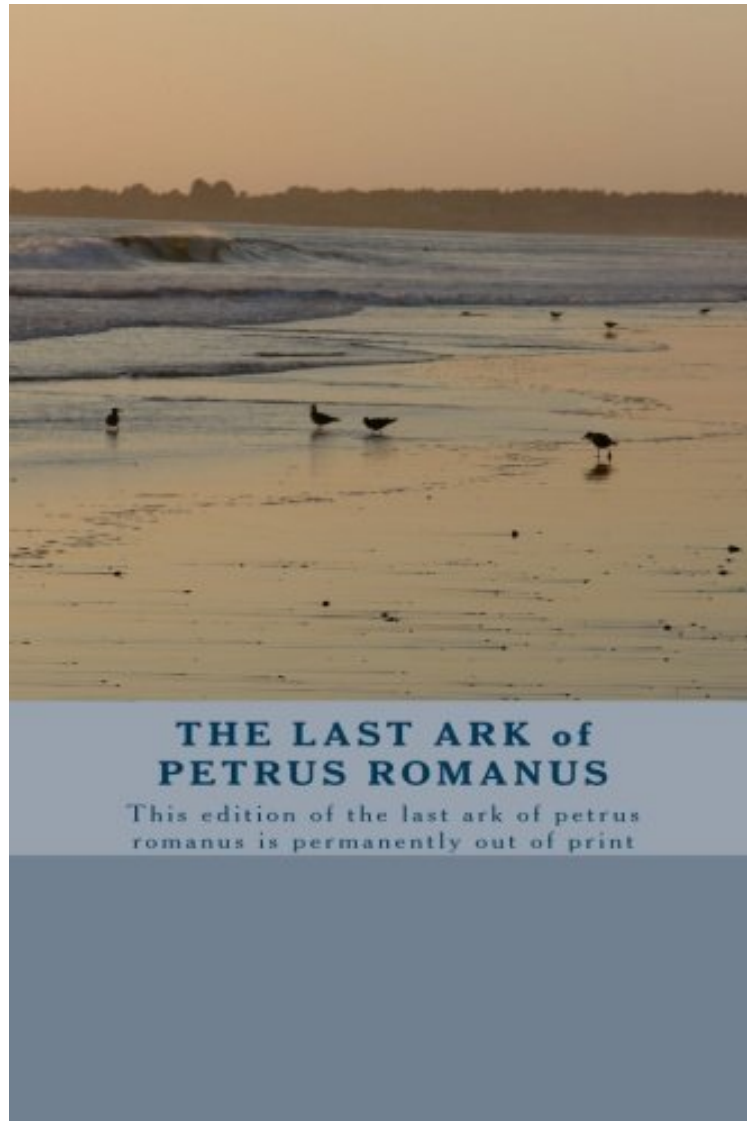

In the vision, the Pope sees an imminent global tribulation. The Ark is the remnant's only means of survival. So the Pope and his two assistants set out and establish the Ark. If the tribulation occurs, most of the world's civilian population would be exterminated,

preparing the way for the Antichrist. The book is Part one of a series. Throughout the story, several prophecies are intricately woven. The politics of socialism are demonized, literally. And the final unity of the Church is accomplished, with Russia emerging as central to Christendom's final stage. The writing style is well-crafted, articulate and thoroughly researched. However, while several complex theological points are explained with a fast-moving but common sense approach, there are one or two theological discussions that are just too complex even for a novel of this scope. The author does leave room for further discussion of these matters in the next Parts. But aside from that, the story draws you in and I didn't want to put it down. This book will appeal to a wide, general audience, because even if you're not Christian, the possibility of the world's ruling elites getting together and coordinating a global EMP attack that would wipe out 70 or 80% or more of the little people, like you and me, is a very real possibility. What defenses do we have? How do we prepare? How can we escape? The characters are nicely developed. I didn't want to see one of them have to leave, but I don't want to spoil it. What I hated most about this book is having to wait for Part two. I highly recommend it. If you're looking for a glimmer of hope at the end of this increasingly dark tunnel that our world is rapidly becoming, take the time to read it. The Last Ark is a prophetic scenario for the coming tribulation. It begins with a vision given to a recalcitrant pope who leaves the Vatican, dressed in street clothes, and sets out to build an Ark – a series of survival camps for the remaining faithful. Through infiltration the Vatican may be taken over by the dark side. The global economy appears to be rapidly imploding. The world's central banking systems are about to collapse, brought on by the final decay of usury. Sound familiar? I've read all of these when they were named Fatima Code. The author has written a whopping good story. It is a story weaved on the skeleton of many Catholic prophesies. I know you didn't think there were anymore, but you're probably not Catholic. He starts with the list prophesied by S. Malachi of Armagh and the last Pope Petrus Romanus, and progresses to the bits published concerning the secret of Fatima, much of which has been kept hidden. He utilizes Fr. Malachi Martin's encyclopedic knowledge of the internal workings of the Curia, along with the entire cast of satanic infiltrators that block every move of the Pope today. He joins his sci-fi premise with S. Louis de Montfort's work on devotion to Our Lady and her rosary which in turn ties to Our Lady's warning at Fatima of total Chastisement, and her rosary, and spins a tale which could pass for a work of fiction ala Norman Mailer.
