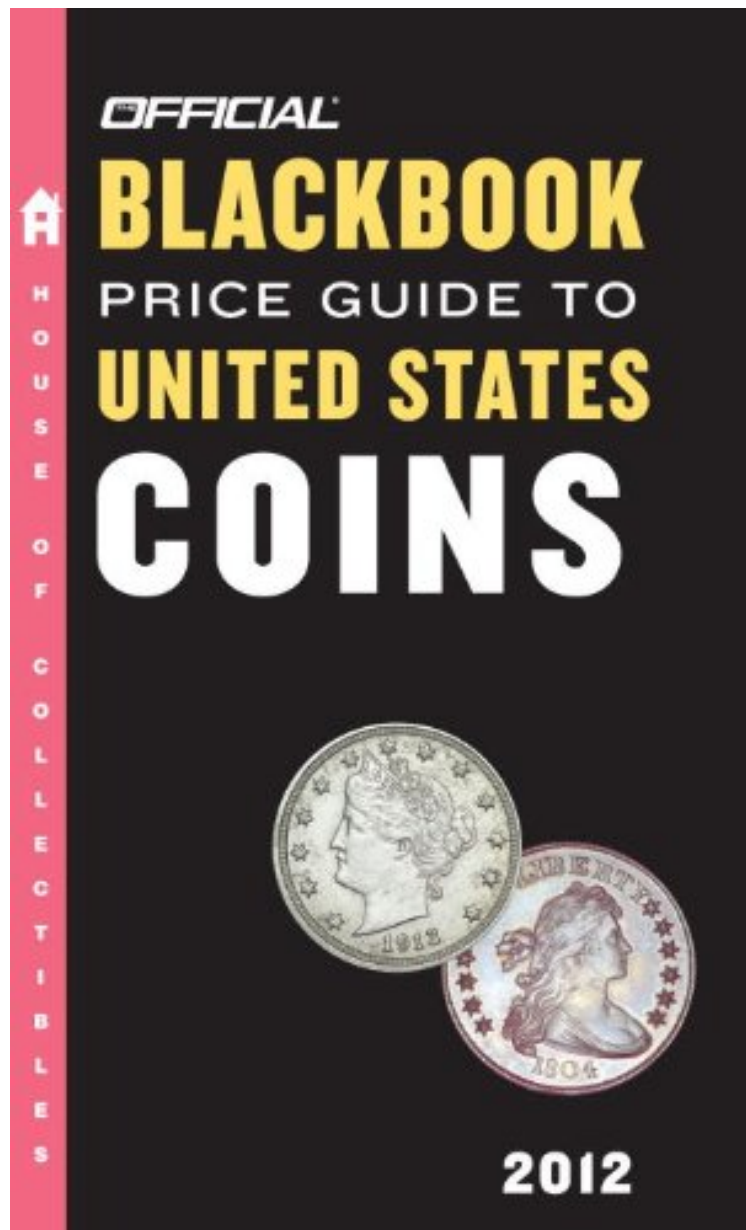

Oberlander This generally useful book is issued annually for the "year ahead", and usually available in early to mid June of the year BEFORE the year it purports to price coins in various grades. The problem with issuing a new (dated ahead) book this early in the year for year ahead is the continued wild fluctuation of the prices of gold and silver. The 2011 version used a gold spot price of \$ 1175.00 and silver about \$ 11.75, and the new 2012 book uses a gold spot price of \$ 1400.00 and silver also at 11.75. Current gold spot price (as this review is written on July 16, 2011) is near \$ 1500 per ounce, and silver is just under \$ 40 now and has been over \$ 40 on April 11, 2011. Given the non-resolution of the USA financial crisis, the prices and direction of metal commodities values are far from certain as to near term direction, so collectors should know that if they have coins to sell, the true values are probably quite a bit higher than current quoted prices in this book. Most dealers are guided by Grey Sheet prices, which are updated weekly. Also many higher graded versions of coins are now simply listed as RARE or VERY RARE rather than quoting a price, which, if quoted, may at least reflect the last known price such an item was sold at. As a LONG time collector, I enjoy the price guide, and have ordered it since 2007 as soon as it became available, but I really consider some of the quoted values and prices as too low.
